Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death to kids. One reason is that most kids ride unbuckled or improperly restrained. Even the most safety-conscious parents often are not aware of the need for booster seats or the danger their children face when improperly restrained in adult seat belts. On a small child, the adult lap belt rides up over the stomach and the shoulder belt cuts across the neck, which could cause serious or even fatal injuries.
